Issues in the Marine Environment

- 600,000 plastic containers dumped into the ocean everyday
- Oil can harm oxygen producing phytoplankton
- Rouge nets can entangle sea life







Pollution

As defined by the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea:

"The introduction by man, directly or indirectly, of substances or energy into the marine environment, including estuaries, which results or is likely to result in such deleterious effects as harm to living resources and marine life, hazards to human health, hindrance to marine activities, including fishing and other legitimate use of the sea, impairment of quality for the use of the sea water and reduction of amenities."





Development of the Blue Flag Programme

- 1985: Blue Flag idea introduced in France
- 1987: Blue Flag introduced in Europe with EU support
- 2001: Blue Flag Programme became international with South Africa
- 2009: NRP Sagres joins Blue Flag Scheme
 - This led STI to develop the Scheme specifically for sail training vessels
- 2012: 58 countries with full Blue Flag status –
- More than 40 sail training vessels registered with Blue Flag

What is Expected

- Never throw anything over-board, whether on land or at sea
- Do no release toilet water into the sea in near coastal waters and sensitive areas.
- Use, and promote the use of, recycling facilities ashore
- Do not buy or use objects made from protected species or from archaeological underwater findings
- Encourages others to take care of our marine environment, and at all other times

Protecting the marine environment is important to all of us. We hope you share our view that it is particularly important for sail training vessels to set a good example, for the trainees who sail with you and those who see your vessel in port.

We have therefore joined forces with the Foundation for Environmental Education to introduce and promote their 'Blue Flag' scheme for sail training vessel owners/operators that belong to one of Sail Training International's member national sail training organisations, or who compete in our races. It is known as the 'Sail Training International Blue Flag Scheme'.

The Foundation for Environmental Education's Blue Flag scheme was introduced many years ago, initially to promote clean beaches and marinas. More recently the FEE extended the scheme to include boat owners. Environmental agencies and organisations around the world promote the Blue Flag scheme.

This new initiative is a collaboration between the Foundation for Environmental Education, based in Denmark, and Sail Training International. It is administered by Sail Training International working with our member national organisations.

What Can You Do?

- Keep a log what comes on and off the ship
 - Involve trainees
- Organize a recycling system onboard
- If it came from the sea, then it can go back into the sea
- Educate your crew/trainees about the consequences of marine waste
- Coordinate with ports to ensure your shipboard waste is disposed of properly
- Be conscious of where you are anchoring and sailing
 - Avoid fishing grounds
 - Avoid damage to sea bottom
